Rituals and celebrations

As in past years Tang Rinpoche led the ceremony for the Longchen Kuchoed in the main temple on 28. January. This year 40 monks participated in the day long prayers. The community came together for the evocative prayers in the temple.

We welcomed the year of the Male Wood Dragon, which came with a roar and a promise of new and positive beginnings as well as renewed strength and vitality. To welcome the year, the Foundation and Heritage House came together with the community to observe the time-honoured celebratory rituals in the temple, where prayers were chanted and greetings were exchanged. Afterwards we all enjoyed a hearty lunch in the sun.

Shortly after the new year celebrations the annual prayers for peace, Shingdrup, were observed over three days. Once again the entire village came together for this occasion and pooled their resources with the Foundation to make offerings at the temple as well as for food and fees for the ritualist. It is always heartening to see how such events bring out the best in people, a sense of collaboration and harmony among the community members.

Alternative power supply

We were fortunate to have the inputs of Eduard Wirth and Dorji, who worked in Ogyen Choling from the 20.-25. January. They worked to repair and re-install the burglar and fire alarm systems. They also made recommendations for the improvements of the lighting in the museum and the guest rooms and the installation of an alternative power supply system. Although the alarm systems could not be fully repaired, this input was very useful, particularly their advice on an alternative power supply system. We feel this is a necessary investment because of the erratic and frequent blackouts seriously affecting the operation of the museum and the guest house. Following the recommendations by Eduard Wirth we have established contacts with a well-known Bhutan based solar company, ZhenPhen. With their expert help we placed an order for of 15 KW system which will be sufficient to provide all required power for up to 10 hours (not including the electric heaters). The material has already been shipped and we are confident that with the help of ZhenPhen we will have a system in place for the forthcoming autumn season.

The cost of the material and shipping was US \$ 13'750. Thanks to the generosity of a donor (G. and A. Tardy) we could cover most of this. We are, however, still looking for an additional US \$ 2500 to cover the full payment.

Staff news

He could schedule time for his studies, and at the same time continue his duties for the museum. He successfully completed his course at the end of March. Phunthso Tenzin found the studies challenging, nevertheless he thought the courses were relevant to his work and broadened his knowledge on the subjects of Asia's art Histories and Exploring and Analysing Arts.

Chador Tshering (incharge of maintenance) was in Gelephu for 4 weeks for Desung Training. Happily, on completion of the training, he received his National Citizen Identification card. Thankfully, during his absence, we were fortunate not have any major breakdown in the electricity, water or sanitation systems.
